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MASP SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST OF THE YEAR

PURPOSE:

To identify and recognize an outstanding School Psychologist and to increase public awareness of our profession. The Michigan School Psychologist of the Year may also be chosen to represent MASP for the NASP School Psychologist of the Year award.

WHO CAN NOMINATE:

Any active MASP member can nominate one candidate. For assistance in this process, please contact your MASP Regional Director or a member of the Executive Board.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE AWARD:

Any full-time, active MASP school psychologist who spends the majority of her/his time providing direct service to students, teachers and/or parents in school settings is eligible.

AWARD PRESENTATION:

The award ceremony will occur at the Spring 2009 MASP Critical Issues Conference Luncheon.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

1. Candidate provides a full range of school psychological services
2. Candidate performs his/her job in an exemplary manner
3. Candidate earns the respect of fellow colleagues, students, teachers and parents
4. Candidate displays pride in our profession and represents school psychology well
5. Candidate is well informed about the standards of the school psychology profession
6. Candidate is willing to be nominated for the NASP School Psychologist award

NOMINATION PROCEDURE:

The Nomination packet must be typed and contain:

1. The completed nomination form
2. A one page nomination statement – giving specific examples of the candidate's exemplary services to children, teachers, parents, schools, etc.
3. The candidate's resume
4. Nominations must be mailed and received by January 13, 2009 so they can be presented to the Executive Board. Late nominations will not be considered. If you have questions contact your Regional Director or MASP Executive Board.
